## **Accessibility Resources**

### **How to View:**

You Will Need:

- Reliable internet access
  - An internet-compatible screen (laptop, CPU monitor, smart TV)
1. Parents, Guardians, and Children's Program Coordinators will register with their name and email address.
  2. There is a "Watch Now" button on the confirmation page, which takes you to our external view page.
  3. Each episode is embedded via Vimeo onto the page.
  4. Episodes will be released weekly on Saturdays. For each episode, parents, guardians, and children's program coordinators will need to resubmit their information.
    - i. The Watch Page will have the previous episodes available to watch
  5. At the end of the series, anyone who registered to watch an episode will be emailed a private link with all of the episodes for you to continue watching at your leisure.

### **What if I don't have reliable internet?**

There are many resources available for folks who do not have easy access to internet. Many libraries offer computers and study rooms available to the public.

Detroit Public Library: anyone with a valid Michigan ID or residency in Detroit or Highland Park can obtain a temporary card and therefore access to the Library's computers and meeting rooms. ### **I have children who are hard of hearing or deaf, what accommodations are available for them?**

We are thrilled to be providing subtitles and ASL interpretations for all of our episodes, with no additional steps. We are committed to making our productions accessible to everyone.

Unfortunately, one limitation is that the subtitles are solely in English. We are continuing to work on providing subtitles in other languages.

**I have neurodiverse children, will there be anything triggering in episodes?**

The episodes do not contain any light sensitive moments: no flashing or flickering lights. There is the occasional lightning flash.

The show does contain some loud sounds: thunder, screams, music. There will be a yellow dot in the upper right corner to signal to adults that a loud or disruptive sound is about to happen.
